ADDENDUM 1 TO THE STAY AT HOME ORDER

Brooks County Judge Eric Ramos issued the Brooks County Stay Home, Stay Safe order on March 27, 2020 which became effective at 10:00 pm on March 29, 2020. Since the order was made public, several questions have arisen. This addendum should clarify the order.

The following addendum is here by incorporated into the Brooks County Stay Home, Stay Safe Order:

The following retail businesses are deemed non-essential. Therefore, must remain closed to the public as part of the Order to Stay Home, Stay Safe issued on March 27, 2020. Businesses listed below may continue to conduct transactions such as completing orders or collecting payments/debt by phone or online.

Apparel/Boutique/Department store

Bars

Gift shop

Hair Salon/Barber Shop

Jewelry

Nail Salon

Office Supply

Florist (Exception: Transactions relating to funerals. Phone/online orders and delivery only.)

Furniture/Appliance stores (Exception: Sale, delivery and repairs of appliances. Phone/online purchases only.)

The addendum to the Brooks County Stay Home, Stay Safe Order becomes effective as specified and shall be strictly observed and enforced as if incorporated fully into that emergency order
