

WARNING TO EVERYONE WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID -19

Any person who has tested positive for Covid-19 and has not been released by the Texas Department of State Health Services, must isolate themselves from other people until they receive a release.

FAILURE TO DO SO may result in violation of Texas Penal Code 22.05 (a) to wit:

“A person commits an offense if he recklessly engages in conduct that places another in imminent danger of serious bodily injury.”

Please note that the victim does not have to get Covid-19 but just be exposed to it without previous warning.

Appearing in public after testing “Positive” **EXCEPT** to get medical care pursuant to CDC guidelines, can lead to your arrest.

Victims of this type of exposure may contact any law enforcement agency or the Brooks County Attorney’s Office.
